

Historical Events

- World War II 1939-1945. By 1945 1 out of 4 married women worked outside the home.
- 1941 Attack on Pearl Harbor. United States enters War
- 1947 House Un-American Activities Committee subpoenaed their 1st Witnesses about communist infiltration in Hollywood
- 1948 Paramount Decree studios must sell their theatres
- 1948 Television Network Programming



Beach Party 1963 Bye Bye Birdie






In the 1950s and early 60s there was an explosion of films targeted at the new teen market – the rock and roll film and beach films portrayed girls as sexy nubile good girl virgins

There is no innocence in the sexually revolutionized female teen




<u>Clueless</u> 1995
